Weatherization Assistance Program

Please bring the following items with you when applying for the Weatherization Assistance Program:

1. Proof of your household's gross income for the past thirty days from the date you sign the application, including all sources of income. (a.) Pay stubs, 2016 social security and/or 2016 retirement/pension benefit verification letters, etc. (b.) If proof of income cannot be provided you will be asked to fill in the "Declaration of Income Statement Form" notarization will be required.
2. Proof of U.S. Citizenship/Residency (a.) You will need a copy of your Birth Certificate or Voters Registration Card (b.) Government Issued Photo ID or Passport (c.) Qualified Alien Status documentation (Permanent Resident I-155 Card or other immigration documentation proving legal status to receive federal benefits). Please Note: This requirement is for the applicant only.
3. Copy of your electric and/or gas/propane utility bills (a.) Please make sure that your account number is visible. (b.) We cannot accept disconnection notices.

City Seeks Public Input for Planning of the Downtown District & East Hondo Avenue to Interstate 35

The City of Devine is working in conjunction with the Center for Urban and Regional Planning Research and the Rural Business Program Institute of Economic Development at the University of Texas at San Antonio to prepare a vision plan for the Downtown District and East Hondo Avenue to Interstate Highway 35. The vision plan will be document designed to guide the future actions of our community. The UTSA Team along with City Staff will be holding a public meeting to hear community input regarding issues impacting the Downtown District and East Hondo Avenue.

The public input meetings will be held on November 10, 2016, at 6:00pm at the Community Hall (East Hondo Avenue). The purpose of this meeting is to have a work-session with community stakeholders to evaluate the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats (SWOT) regarding this vision plan study. The City encourages residents to attend this meeting so that we can acquire as much feedback from the community as possible; so your voice can be heard.

Following the public input meetings, a vision plan will be prepared by the UTSA Team and presented at a future open meeting of City Council.
